Mount Baldy Ski Resort: An Insider's Guide

Planning Your Trip

Best Time to Visit: Mid-season (January & February) offers the most reliable snow conditions. Weekdays generally have fewer crowds.

Accommodation: Mount Baldy offers a range of lodging options, including ski-in/ski-out condos, cozy cabins, and nearby hotels/motels in Oliver. Consider amenities, group size, and budget when choosing.

On the Slopes

Terrain: 400 acres of skiable terrain, with a mix of 20% beginner, 50% intermediate, and 30% advanced runs.

Lifts: Three main lifts: Eagle Chairlift, Sugarlump Quad, and Magic Carpet. Check the resort's website for current lift operating status.

Trail Map: Familiarize yourself with the trail map to plan your routes and find runs suitable for your skill level.

Backcountry Skiing: Accessible with appropriate safety gear and experience. Guided tours are available.

Beyond Skiing

Snowshoeing: Explore the resort's scenic snowshoe trails, ranging from beginner to expert levels.

Cross-Country Skiing: Over 20 kilometers of groomed trails for all abilities.

Tubing: Enjoy the thrill of Mount Baldy's tubing park.

Ice Skating: The resort maintains an outdoor ice skating rink.

Essential Information

Location: Near Oliver, BC, approximately 45 minutes from Penticton.

Average Snowfall: 250 inches (635 cm) per season.

Elevation: Summit at 7,000 feet (2,134 meters), with a vertical drop of 1,300 feet (396 meters).

Operating Hours: Typically Wednesday-Sunday, 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. Check the website for holiday and peak season hours.

Amenities: On-mountain dining, rental shop, ski school, and more.

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
